Founded in Germany in 1934 to help Jews fleeing Germany, The Blue Card continued in the U.S. to enable survivors to start over again in this country. The name refers to the blue card originally issued to donors to keep a record of their donations.

The Blue Card is the only organization in the U.S. dedicated exclusively to aiding Jewish Holocaust survivors, and when necessary, their psychologically affected children.
